Checklist for Minor Requirements in Law, Societies, and Justice

Students may declare the LSJ minor any time after officially declaring a major and after reaching sophomore standing or higher (at least 45 college level credits). To actually declare the minor, meet with the adviser in your major department to fill out the minor declaration paperwork and to make sure that adding this minor will not slow down your satisfactory progress to degree.

Although being declared as an LSJ minor will not give a special preference when registering for classes, it will help the LSJ Program plan their curriculum to better satisfy the needs of students. If you are having difficulty getting into LSJ classes, please meet with an LSJ Adviser.
